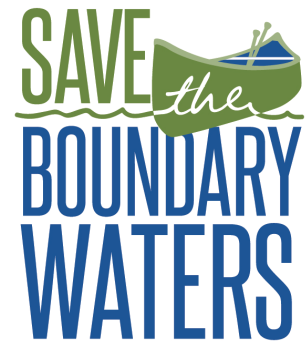


Campaign to Save the Boundary Waters

Summary:

The Campaign to [Save the Boundary Waters](#) is a nonprofit organization seeking a GIS Specialist to develop map products to support our mission: to protect the Boundary Waters Canoe Area Wilderness from sulfide-ore copper-nickel mining. The Campaign relies heavily on science, data, and maps in telling the story of the Boundary Waters and how sulfide-ore copper mining would irreparably harm it. The Campaign's images and maps have been displayed during debate on the floor of the U.S. House of Representatives, and presented to federal agencies including the U.S. Department of Interior, the Bureau of Land Management, the U.S. Department of Agriculture and the U.S. Forest Service, and the White House Council on Environmental Quality.

Minimum Qualifications:

- Proficiency in ArcMap
- Ability to collect geospatial data from public sources
- Basic knowledge of cartographic design
- Strong written and oral communication skills
- Interest in nonprofit work and environmental conservation

Preferred Qualifications:

- Proficiency in ArcGIS Online
- Experience with ArcGIS Collector
- Experience with georeferencing and digitizing static maps into ArcGIS
- Familiarity with the BWCAW
- Demonstrated interest in environmental science, environmental policy, conservation, hydrology, forestry, or similar.
